NOTICE OF RACE

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the 'rules' as defined in the current Racing Rules of Sailing.
- 1.2 The conditions for the Chubb Jr. Championships will apply. **Condition 8.2 is modified to read, "Coaches are required to hold U.S. Sailing Level 1 or greater certification."**

- 1.3 The Rules of the Thistle, CFJ, 420 and Laser Performance and Laser Radial classes will apply unless modified by the Sailing Instructions.
- 1.4 Competitors need not be members of the class association.

2 ADVERTISING

This is a category A event.

3 ELIGIBILITY AND ENTRY

- 3.1 The regatta is open to boats of the (triple handed) Thistle, (double handed) Club 420, (single-handed), Laser, Vanguard Club Flying Junior & Laser Radial rig class.
- 3.2 All competitors must:
 - A. Have reached their 13th birthday, but not their 19th birthday during the calendar year. For 2008, any sailor with a birth date between 1/1/90 and 12/31/95 is eligible to compete at Junior Bay Week.
 - B. Be members of US SAILING.
 - C. Be members of an I-LYA affiliated club.
 - D. Have participated in at least three regattas (two in open water or one open water event if they competed at a previous I-LYA Junior Regatta at Put-in-Bay) since the conclusion of 2007 Junior Race Week.
- 3.3 Eligible competitors must be entered by their I-LYA club by completing the entry forms and sending them, with the required Birth Certificates and USSailing Membership numbers, together with the required fee, to I-LYA 2008 c/o Phil and Sue Moehle, 620 Perry St. Vermilion, Oh 44089.
- 3.4 Late entries may be accepted after June 23, 2008 under the following conditions: All proper
D. Have participated in at least three regattas (two in open water or one open water event if they paperwork is received, and a late fee of \$20 per competitor is added to the entry fee.

3.5 The following restrictions on the number of boats apply: Each club may send up to 9 competitors (all classes combined). Additional competitors for each club may be granted on a resume basis, provided that the proper fees are paid and received prior to the deadline.

3.6 Launch Dollies: All clubs shall supply a one launch dolly—Seitech or equivalent, in good working order for each dry sailed boat : 420, CFJ, Laser, Laser Radial. Each dolly should have suitable identification so that at the end of the regatta, owner and dolly can be reunited. During the regatta, dollies will be “pooled” in order to provide for efficient launch and haul out. Thistles will be wet sailed on mooring balls provided by the organizing authority.

3.7 All competitors and chaperones must report to the Put-in-Bay Yacht Club (PiBYC) before 1330, Sunday July 13, 2008 for registration, housing assignments, boat inspection and chaperone schedules in order to remain eligible.

4 FEES

4.1 Required fees are as follows:

4.1.1 Fee per competitor \$300. \$20 per competitor late fee if entry is received after June, 23, 2008.

4.1.2 Other fees: \$200 per club for a boat/room damage deposit. The fee for unreturned safety boat flags will be deducted from this \$200.

5 QUALIFYING SERIES AND FINAL SERIES

The regatta will consist of a qualifying series and a final series for all fleets except for the Laser Radial fleet and the CFJ fleet.

6 SCHEDULE

6.1 Registration: Sunday, July 13, 2008 from 1000 to 1330.

6.2 Racing is scheduled on the following days: July 14, July 15, July 16, and July 17, 2008.

6.3 The numbers of races scheduled are as follows: Qualifying Series will consist of a maximum of 6 races, and a minimum of 1 race. All other series will consist of a minimum of one race, with no maximum number of races.

6.4 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race each day is 0845.

6.5 There will be no warning signal after 1400 on the last day of racing.

7 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

The sailing instructions will be available at registration.

8 VENUE

Racing will be held on the waters of Lake Erie off the shores of Put-In-Bay Yacht Club and Middle Bass Island.

The scoring system is as follows:

9.1 1 race will be required to be completed to constitute a series.

9.2 Qualifying series scores will not be carried over to the final series.

9.3 The Low Point Scoring System of RRS Appendix A will apply, except as modified in 9.4, 9.5 and 9.6 below.

9.4 When fewer than 5 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

9.5 When from 5 to 9 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

9.6 When 10 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

9.7 "Appendix P, Immediate Penalty for breaking rule 42 will apply in the Quarterfinal Series only.

P2.2 is changed to "Second and subsequent Protests"

P2.3 is deleted.

P3 is changed as follows: "but the protest is counted to determine the number of times she has been protested during the series" is deleted.

10 PRIZES

Teams finishing first, second and third in the Triple handed and first, second, third, fourth and fifth in the double-handed and single-handed final series will qualify to go on to the Chubb Jr. Area E semi-finals regatta. Please consult the 2008 I-LYA Yearbook for a complete outline of awards and prizes.

11 HOUSING

Will be provided for competitors only. No others will be permitted to stay in competitors' rooms.

12 LIFE JACKETS

US (or Canadian) Coast Guard approved PFDs must be worn by competitors at all times while on the water.

13 SUPPORT BOATS

Spectator boats may be available. ALL coach boats must be approved by and registered with the Organizing Authority. Regulations regarding on-the-water Coaching will be specified in the Sailing Instructions. Each club will be expected to provide one safety boat for every 6 competitors registered.

14 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See RRS Rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury including death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.
